Alpha Epsilon Pi brother Raphael, 21, joined Gift of Life during a drive held for the fraternity's philanthropy week. Two years later he got that miracle call that he could save a man diagnosed with myelodysplastic syndrome, a type of blood cancer.

He not only donated stem cells, he came back a second time to give his recipient a booster donation of white blood cells.

"I don't consider myself special or different for having done this," said Raphael. "I just feel like I made the decision anyone in their right mind would make if they got the news informing them they're a match. Saving your fellow humans is what this experience is about."

Nicole

Nicole, 19, was just a high school senior when she was called down to the front office with some other students and invited to join the registry through the Dr. Michael Osband Senior Swab program. She had lost her great-grandmother to blood cancer and knew how important it was to do what she could.

Within six months, Nicole matched a woman in need of a transplant! She had a great donation experience at Gift of Life's collection center, and was gratified to be able to help save a life so easily.

"When I learned that my recipient had survived it was a great feeling," she said. "Donating made me feel like I had an impact on her life. The point of doing it is to help someone, to save their life, and that is something to take pride in."




Donor Isabel, 25, met her recipient Nancy, 17, during a Cocktails & Conversation Nantucket




Donor Owen, 26, met his recipient William, 41, at a Florida Panthers game

Each swab kit costs \$60 to process at the laboratory, so this support makes a huge impact on the lives of patients who are seeking their matching donors.

CAMPUS AMBASSADOR PROGRAM HAS SAVED MORE THAN 620 LIVES!









The Gift of Life Campus Ambassador Program (CAP) is our primary approach to recruiting the crucial donor demographic of 18 to 25 year olds. Transplant centers request these donors most often as they give recipients the best chance of a successful result. Since the program's launch in 2014, the program has added more than 107,000 new donors to the registry, resulting in over 5,800 matches for patients and more than 620 lifesaving transplants.

In 2023, 552 campus ambassadors represented Gift of Life at 146 colleges across the United States. Two hundred and fifteen of the top ambassadors were invited to South Florida to participate in a multiday training session. With

such a large number, two symposiums were held, one in July and one in August. Topics included how to run a recruitment drive, making compelling presentations, and working successfully with other student organizations.

Lunch and Learn: We provide the lunches and the educator (possibly a donor or recipient to share their experience), and your team learns how easy it is to save someone's life.


Corporate Sponsorships: Gift of Life hosts events across the United States each year and high-visibility sponsorships are a great way to show the community that you're committed to saving lives.





Redefining Cell and Gene Therapy Starting Material

Today, incredible advances are being made in immunotherapies that begin with blood stem cells, the same cells we currently use for transplantation to cure blood cancer and more than 70 other diseases. There is now a significant demand from medical research and biopharma-

ceutical firms for peripheral blood stem cells to form the building blocks for next generation living drugs.

Gift of Life has stepped up to meet this exciting moment in medical innovation by creating the Gift of Life Biologics division.

"Our goal for Biologics is to be a single source for the new era of therapeutics by tapping into our donor registry, collection center, cell therapy laboratory, quality systems and information technology, all housed under one roof at Gift of Life's 32,000 s.f. headquarters," said Gift of Life Founder and CEO Jay Feinberg.

With more than 437,000 donors in the registry who are already tissue-type tested, and an in-house apheresis facility to collect stem cells, Gift of Life is able to provide medical research and development organizations with the cells needed to create new medications.

Some immunotherapy products may target specific types of cancer, while others may be customized to treat a patient with a rare condition when no other options exist.

"When we invite donors to give stem cells for research projects through Biologics, they have the potential to save many lives with one donation," said Gift of Life Biologics CEO Eric Strati.

Cellular therapies are the future of medicine, and through its commitment to innovation and development, Gift of Life is positioned to be at the forefront of this medical revolution.
